PROGRAM

PP Bill Bow introduced guest speaker **Tim Steinberger**, Director-Environmental Services Department of the City and County of Honolulu. Tim discussed the Waste Water Consent Decree.

The City and County of Honolulu must pay \$1.6 million in civil penalties as part of a proposed consent decree requiring it to undertake more than \$1.2 billion in upgrades to its sewer system and plants during the next 25 years. Details of the city's settlement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the state Department of Health show the city may have avoided steep increases in sewer fees charged to homeowners by agreeing to make upgrades over a lengthy period. Nonetheless,

sewer fees will rise if a federal court approves the agreement in coming weeks (expect an average of 4-6% increase annually). The agreement resolves long-standing lawsuits and compliance orders the city has faced as the EPA, state and three environmental groups pressed it to improve its sewage systems and plants. The EPA and state have long wanted the city to improve its system, which has had breakdowns and spills, including a 2006 incident in which raw sewage poured into the Ala Wai Canal



The main points of the settlement include:

- -Requiring a series of repairs, improvements and upgrades to sewer lines and pumping stations be finished by June 30, 2020
- -Setting deadlines for 40 projects to be completed by the end of 2016, including assessing 650 miles of sewers with closed-circuit television systems and repairing or replacing 144 miles of gravity sewers
- -Giving the city until June 2024 to upgrade the Honouliuli treatment plant in Ewa Beach to secondary treatment standards
- -Setting a deadline of Dec. 31, 2035, for completing secondary treatment upgrades at the Sand Island plant
- -Requiring quarterly and annual reports from the city

- -Update operations and maintenance manuals for all pump stations.
- -Develop standardized training procedures.

Promoting world understanding through Future Vision



As February is World Understanding Month it could be a good time to think of the international service provided by Rotarians, clubs, and districts in light of the Future Vision pilot.

District 9800 (Australia) has allocated an amount of its district grant funds to send a medical team to Timor-Leste to implement a training program for midwives to help reduce the mortality rate of mothers and infants during childbirth. The district has also budgeted an amount to install a solar-powered water pump for a school and neighboring community in Tanzania.

District 2070 (San Marino; Italy) is planning for a number of large district grant activities, including sending medical volunteers to humanitarian projects in Kosovo, Peru, and Madagascar, medical equipment to Congo, and a vocational training team to District 7490 (New Jersey, USA).

The Rotary Club of San Ignacio, Belize (District 4250), is host sponsor together with the international sponsor Rotary Club of South Cowichan (Mill Bay), B.C., Canada (District 5020), on a project to construct an open drainage system on the campus of Sacred Heart College (high school) in Belize to prevent flooding of the school and the breeding of mosquitos that transmit dengue fever. There is also being implemented a multiplatform public health education campaign in cooperation with school authorities, the

municipality, and community leaders, which will make the project sustainable.

There are several similarly good projects being implemented in many places throughout the world, all leading up to Building Communities -- Bridging Continents through Service Above Self.
