PROGRAM

Bill Bow introduced our guest speaker. **Perry K. Martin** has served as President of Maryknoll School since July 1, 2008. He completed his high school education at Corvallis High School in Corvallis, Oregon where he was a scholar athlete earning varsity letters in football, basketball, baseball, and track. He attended Oregon College of Education, in Monmouth, Oregon from 1975-1979 completing his Bachelor's Degree in education. Oregon College of Education awarded him the title "Outstanding Person in Teacher Education" at graduation. He completed his Master's Degree in Education and Computer Education at Western Oregon State College in 1983.

Mr. **Martin** has 30 years of educational experience, including more than a decade of Catholic school administration. He was previously Head of School at Marist Catholic High School in Eugene, Oregon and Principal of Sacred Heart Catholic School (K-8) in Medford, Oregon. He also held teaching positions in Dhahran and Ras Tanura, Saudi Arabia working with

Aramco Schools.

Maryknoll Schools is creating 21st century learners, leaders, and citizens of character.

Founded in 1927, Maryknoll School is Oahu's largest coeducational Catholic School, serving students from kindergarten through grade 12, enrolling nearly 1,400 students of diverse ethnic, geographic and socioeconomic backgrounds. Our Catholic learning environment is designed to support all our students, nearly half of whom are not Catholic. Maryknoll School has a number of need-based and non-need based scholarships available to current and newly enrolling students, and 20% of our current students receive financial aid. Since 2007, 100% of our graduating seniors have gone on to higher education.

Perry encouraged all members to invest 100% -- nights and weekends -- to make a difference through club activities and he pledged \$150 to support our Rotary youth activities.

Perry said kids have different "magnetic poles". We used to assume all kids learned the same way, now we know differently. Teachers also teach differently, analytically versus globally, hence the need to teach "personally" versus the "herd" and to provide kids opportunity to seek their own strengths.

As a magnet's north and south poles attract/repulse, and stronger magnets attracts/repulses more strongly, so teachers attract or repulse, and kids do better or worse. When a teacher is close to the students, the teacher attracts more (more power), versus a teacher further away (from the herd) is less powerful and effective. Kids are born to learn, but should be grouped by HOW they learn, not by gender; Maryknoll Schools will start to assess this way as we look for better results in teaching.

Using the right teaching/learning style can accelerate learning (SOME opposite learning style can also be beneficial to the student)

The shift is on! How well will schools shift?

Rigor, gives kids a challenge wherever they are along the learning path, in a personalized way, with rigor, students' progress from simply memorization to synthesis and comprehension.

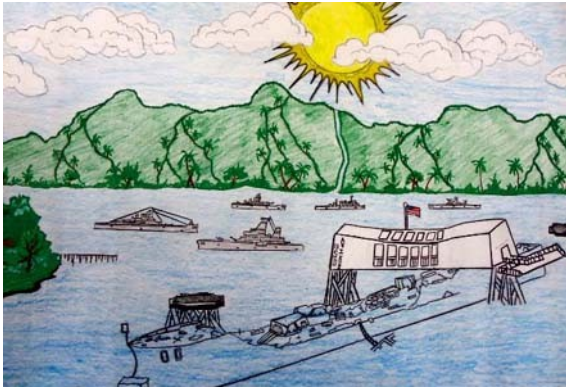
