PROGRAM

Program Chair, **Jeff Deer**, introduced the speaker of the day, **Theo Stiller**, of the Pearlridge Rotary Club. **Theo Stiller** is a local boy who lived in Luxembourg for six years as a child. He is the second oldest of five kids. His father is from Germany and mom is from Japan.

Theo has been working with Wealth Strategy Partners for five years. They are the fastest growing business planning and financial services company in Hawaii. In five years, they have grown from two to 50 advisors with offices in Honolulu and Maui. He is very passionate about helping people and small businesses

guard against unsafe financial planning and true predators of wealth. His drive to help people and the community has led to his interest and passion in helping Rotary grow. **Theo** lives in Honolulu with his wife, Amy and 11 month old son Luca.

Theo is also a past president of the Rotary Club of Pearlridge and is passionate about spreading the IGNITE initiative to other clubs as membership development and retention is everyone's business. Retention begins at the club level with members being satisfied with other members, with the location, food, speakers and projects. With a good foundation, the club becomes vibrant and healthy. As of December 2011, there are 1,783 Rotarians in District 5000, up from 1,751 in July 2011. A survey was taken in 2010 to gauge the general public's awareness and perception, and the results were consistent with those of a similar survey taken in 2006. People have heard about Rotary, but do not know much about what Rotary does. We must tell people what we do in Rotary and why we remain in Rotary. Rotary offers members personal growth and development, leadership development, public speaking skills, social skills, vocational skills, development of ethics and the opportunity to serve. We are, simply put, the best service organization in the world. The IGNITE mission is to reverse the 10 year downward trend in membership by motivating the clubs and getting all members involved. The IGNITE initiative will award points to members who get involved in activities, because everyone has something to contribute to the club. An IGNITE chart will be maintained by the club to track the number of points the club achieves. Every club has the opportunity to become a Premier Club and to receive the Governor's Premier Club citation.

Theo encouraged everyone to really get involved in recruiting new members, because everyone has the power to make a difference.

Ignite Premier Club Governor's Membership Citation



The Purpose:
To ignite every ROTARIAN by involving them in one or more of the following activities to obtain points.

Rationale:
Everyone has something to contribute toward the success of their Club; therefore, every person has the power to make a difference.

How to Become a Premier Club and Receive the Governor's Membership Citation:

Multiply the number of Club members by 10 (for example, 38 members x 10

= 380 points.) This will be the Club minimum number of points needed to become a Premier Club.

How to Obtain Points?

Bring in a new member	25 pts.
New member brings in a New Member (Bonus in addition to #1)	20 pts.
Establish a Club Membership Goal	20 pts.
Develop a Membership Committee of 4 or more	15 pts.
Select and complete 4 or more of the "15 + Tips for Successful Clubs"	10 pts.
Assign a Mentor to each New Member for each one	10 pts.
Give Committee Assignment to New Member in First Week	10 pts.

Hold Firesides (Training) for New Members	10 pts.
for each one	
New Member Participates in Service Project	10 pts.
Potential Member gets Involved in Service Project	10 pts.
Invite a District Membership Committee Member to be a Speaker at your Club	10 pts.
Develop an Attractive Website	10 pts.
Hold a Club Assembly focused on Membership	5 pts. for
each attendee	
Bring a Visitor to a Club Meeting	5 pts.
Propose a New Member	5 pts.
Assign a Member to Keep Track of Points	5 pts.
Attend the District Membership Seminar	5 pts. for
each attendee	
If EVERY MEMBER of your Club Participates in 1 or more of the above	50 pts.

Club Recognition:

District Award to best Club on percentage basis will be presented at the District Conference.
Every Premier Club will receive the Ignite Emblem shown above to sew onto their banner.

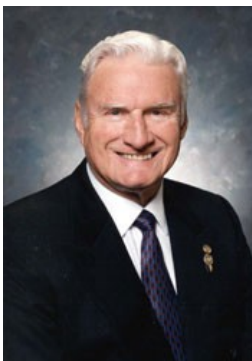
